WHAT?









Why are the youth concerned?

In 2023, young people expressed concern about numerous issues impacting them locally, particularly from a global perspective, due to a rise in sociopolitical awareness. Their primary concern was the lack of mental health resources and their inaccessibility. In this age of technology, these issues are highly relevant to youth, fostering empathy and making them acutely aware of their need for mental health support.

Additionally, young people reported feeling a lack of voice and power, ranking this as their second major concern. They believe that censorship in the media limits their ability to be heard, whether at school, home, or by government officials, leading to persistent issues.

Many of the surveyed youth come from lowincome communities in San Diego, a city with some of the highest rent rates in the country. As more young people enter the workforce, job accessibility and economic security remain significant concerns.



However, young people are seeking better opportunities and job positions, but many employers require experience that these youth have not had the opportunity to gain. This creates additional hurdles for them in accessing better opportunities.

Lastly, the youth highlight climate change as one of their significant concerns. They feel its effects and see its impact on their communities in South San Diego County. Climate change remains a major topic in the news and media, and young people feel that only a few individuals in power have the ability to promptly address and reverse its impacts.

Community Highlights

Youth perspectives in the County of San Diego

In the assessment, we asked youth to highlight their primary concerns within their communities. The map on the right illustrates these concerns, categorized into the following options: lack of youth voice, lack of jobs, housing issues, mental health concerns, and gun violence.

Mental health emerged as a significant concern, with youth linking it to pressures from academics, social life, and their environments. Additionally, there were notable worries about the accessibility of mental health services, particularly in communities of concern, where youth observe a high need for assistance.

Youth also reported experiencing a lack of youth voice, indicating that even those who are highly engaged in their communities feel they lack platforms to be heard. This assessment was conducted solely among youth, reflecting their perspectives rather than those of traditionally engaged constituents. Young people often voice their concerns through non-profits and programs, but they hope their elected officials and representatives at all levels will listen to them.

The youth were limited to these options because they have consistently identified these areas of concern in previous years. The lack of jobs was a prominent issue, as youth have expressed that the economy and employment opportunities are not improving. Additionally, the issue of gun violence underscores the direct impact of gun use and prevalence on youth, particularly those living south of Interstate 8. Together, these insights provide a clear picture of the critical issues facing youth in their communities.



Although the icons don't reflect most of their individual responses, the youth are also concerned about the global environment and the uncertainty of their future. Additionally, they highlighted housing as a significant issue because San Diego is one of the most expensive cities in the nation to live in. The youth aspire for a healthy and affordable future.

Youth Power Cooperative

The YPC is a safe space where organizations and youth can discuss social justice and support each other's efforts.

In 2023, Youth Will held events focused on mental health and youth wellness. These events and the discussions within the Youth Power Cooperative meetings addressed one of the youth's main concerns: mental health. Participants in this program learned about resources and actions to take when personal and social issues impact their well-being.

Civic Engagement

Youth Will members advocate for equity and better opportunities for youth year round

In 2023, Youth Will advocated for San Diego City Youth Commissioners to receive clear directions and resources to influence decisions at the city level. The Youth Commission is a platform where young people can advise elected officials and actively participate in local government processes. Those who apply and secure a seat on the commission gain a voice in local governance. Additionally, Youth Will provided Civic Education Workshops for commissioners and other interested youth, enhancing their understanding and engagement in civic matters.




Addressing Concerns

Opportunity Youth Collaborative

Created to eliminate silos, amplify collaborative services, and enhance multi-sector networking to support youth in reaching self succfiency.

Through the Opportunity Youth Collaborative, Youth Will has been steadfast in closing gaps and addressing systemic issues that marginalize youth. In 2023, we launched a comprehensive resource website that provides essential information about educational and workforce opportunities across the county, in addition to other resources. This initiative aims to mitigate job insecurity and other pressing issues identified by youth, empowering them to navigate their futures with greater confidence and support.






Climate Justice Action Team
